

Theta Chi: A Fraternity of Leaders

Leading By Example In the “Dry Heat”

On Wednesday morning, July 21st, as I was walking into the window-lined entranceway of the Squaw Peak Hilton Resort in Phoenix Arizona, I knew that something special was about to happen. Thanks in part to the support of the Foundation Chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity, more than 300 undergraduate and alumnus Theta Chi brothers from all over the United States and Canada were beginning to gather and reconnect.

The 32nd School of Fraternity Practices (SFP) and 148th Anniversary Convention started Wednesday, July 21st and ended on Saturday night, July 24th, with the Closing Banquet and awards ceremony.

Undergraduates from 125 different chapters participated in 43 breakout sessions that covered a variety of Fraternity issues and professional development skills.

One very popular breakout session was entitled “I’d like to motion that we have shorter meetings,” which taught participants how to run more effective and quicker meetings. Another session entitled “Where did our Alumni go? We want them back,” gave participants many new ideas on how to best reengage their chapter’s alumni.

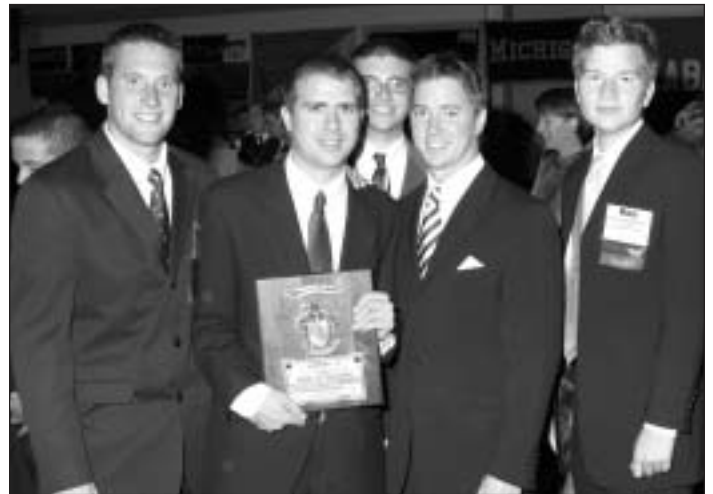
Among the highlights of the conference was a keynote address by motivational speaker and educator Will Kiem, a member of Delta Upsilon Fraternity. Will’s fiery style of speaking had everyone on the edge of their chairs and listening intently to his message. His speech focused upon taking responsibility for your actions and how to be a better man by living what you “preach.”

Another key moment was a speech on living the ritual by Father Philip T. Bowers (Alpha Delta/ Purdue University). Father Phil, as he is known, spoke with a passion about Theta Chi and our commitment to the Ritual in our daily lives.

At the closing banquet, Dave DeVol (Gamma Theta/San Diego State '59) spoke of Theta Chi’s past and his confidence in our Fraternity’s future. Brother DeVol, who was attending his 22nd convention, shared his unique perspective with all those in attendance.

One light moment of the event was the performance by comedian Buzz Sutherland (Beta Xi/ Birmingham Southern College) who had everyone rolling in the aisles with his off-the-wall brand of comedy.

Our Theta Chi Initiative Program continued with the Lambda Class, our twelfth group in this program, taking part. Each year the International Headquarters picks twelve undergraduate participants by application, to take part in a special advanced leadership track opportunity. Clarence Frank (Eta Omicron/ Northwestern State '00) Regional Counselor in the Southwest Region and former Leadership and Education Consultant, and Amy Wrye, Leadership Education Committee member and Coordinator of Resident Life for Kennesaw State University, developed a fast-paced curriculum for the Initiative Program that included the opportunity to interact with the Grand Chapter and extended sessions with the keynote speakers. In keeping with the Initiative group’s theme of “One Band: One Sound,” each member was



taught how to play three songs on a classical instrument. They later performed those songs for the closing of the School of Fraternity Practices and received a standing ovation.

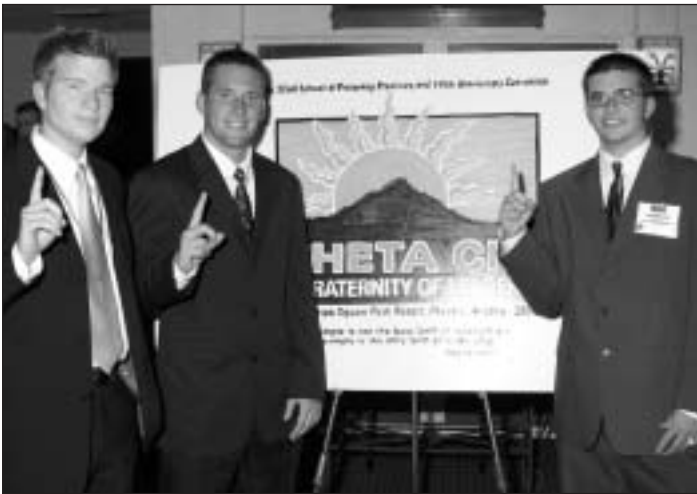
The theme for the event was Theta Chi: A Fraternity of Leaders, “*Example is Not The Best Form of Leadership, Example is The Only Form of Leadership,*” Albert Einstein, noted scientist and mathematician.

It did not take long for this theme to be proven true as the interactions between alumnus members and undergraduates in small group discussions brought brothers closer together. The Helping Hand was very evident in the way chapters joined together to find solutions to the challenges that each chapter faces.

The School of Fraternity Practices and Convention service project was a children’s book drive for Early Headstart. I thank the individuals and chapters that donated books to this organization. One chapter, Nu/Hampden-Sydney College, donated more than 100 new books. A representative from Early Headstart remarked that the “neediest of the needy” are learning to read, and Theta Chi Fraternity is to be thanked.
