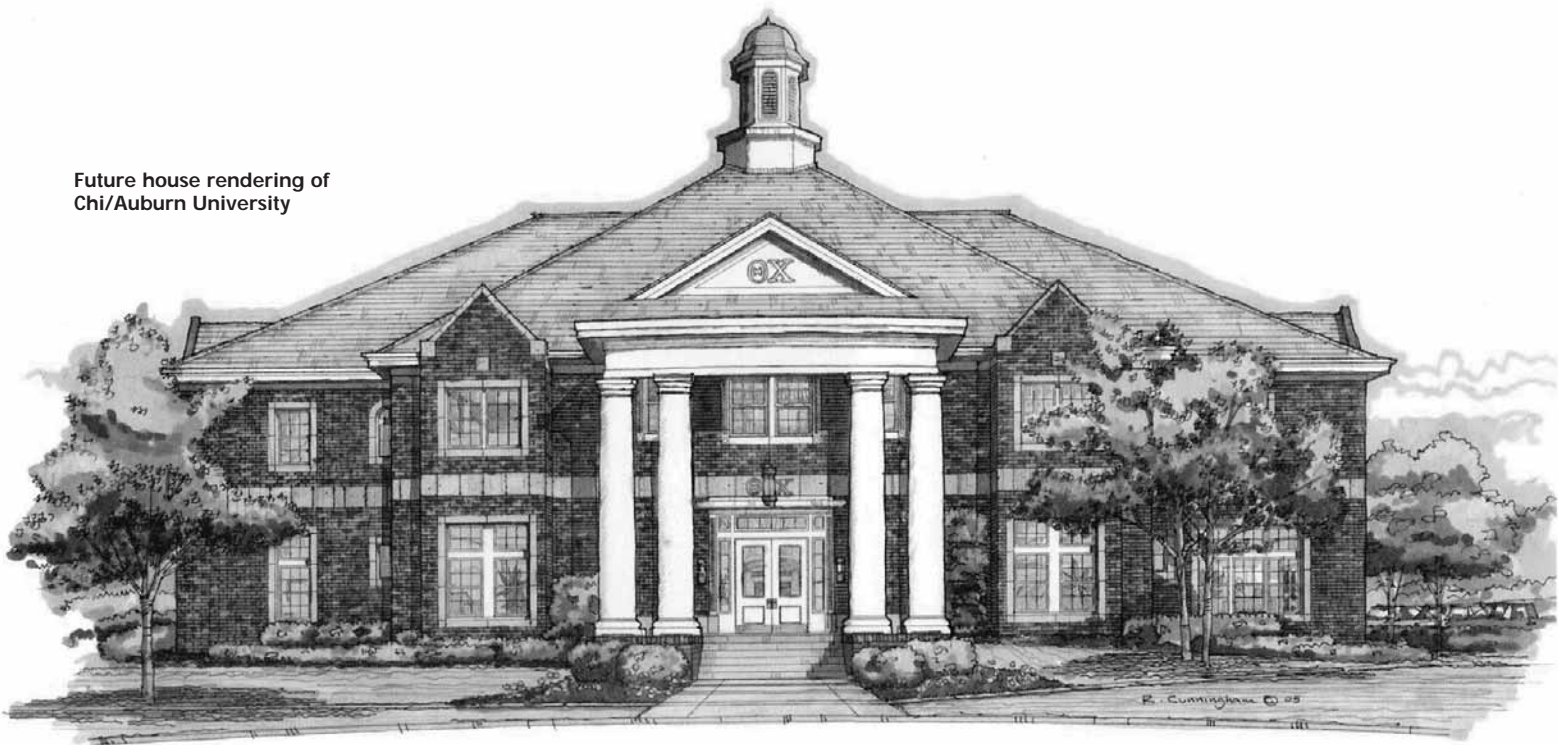
Today's student can't live in yesterday's fraternity house.

Chi/Auburn University

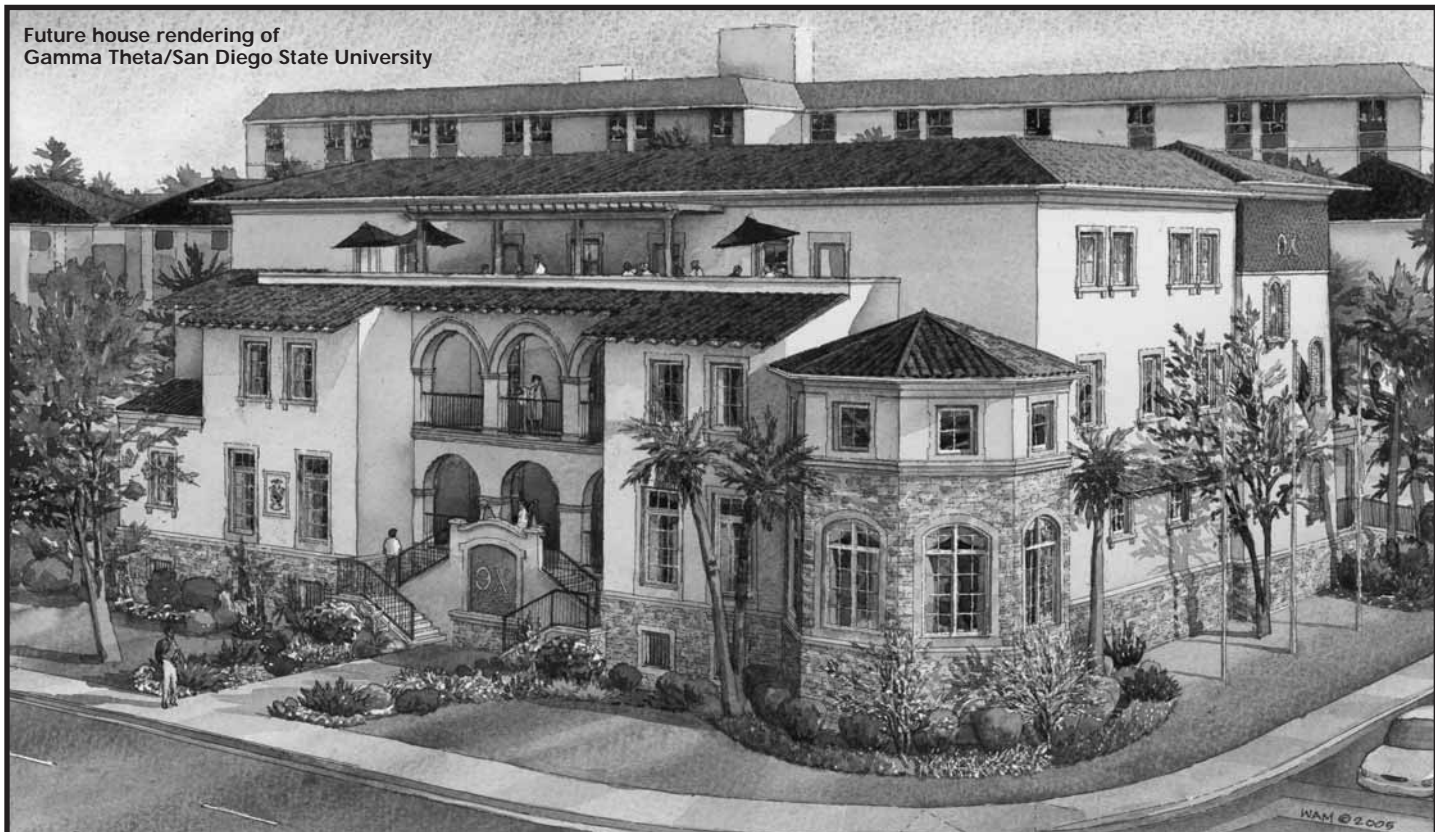


Norwich Housing Corporation Future Housing for Tomorrow's Leaders
